Safety Rules and Etiquette

1. Guns must be carried unloaded, with breech open, at all times.
2. Immediately on shooting from any station the gun shall be opened while still pointed in the direction of the target.
3. No gun shall be put to the shoulder, or aimed in any way except when the shooter is located as follows:
 - a. on the tracks
 - b. on the pattern board (with club management's permission)
 - c. under direction of a qualified coach
4. In the event of an apparent misfire or gun malfunction, the shooter shall keep the gun pointed in the direction of the target area, and call the referee's attention for further instruction.
5. When moving from No 5 to No 1 track, guns shall be unloaded, with breech open. Shooters will pass behind the referee where possible.
6. On the appearance of a red flag at the trap house, all shooters will immediately unload.
7. No shooter will close a gun until on his correct mark and it is his turn to shoot.
8. Thongs and/or slip-on shoes are not permitted. Enclosed footwear is mandatory.
9. No person will consume alcohol until after he or she has completed shooting for the day / competition. Persons under the influence of alcohol will not be permitted to shoot and asked to leave the range.
10. Hearing and eye protection is strongly recommended.
11. All shooters of the squad shall remain on their track until the last shooter has shot his last target.
12. Mobile phones or like devices must not be audible during a squad or competition.
13. Do not walk, talk, fidget or otherwise behave objectionably when it is the next shooters turn to shoot.
14. Do not move from your track until the next shooter has fired.
15. The President and Committee members are Honorary. They expect your assistance and co-operation at all times.
16. Any shooter committing and ungentle manly or unsafe act on the shooting ground shall be liable to suspension or disqualification.
17. Any shooter deliberately firing at any fauna on any shooting ground shall be immediately suspended by the Club Management and shall remain suspended until the incident is dealt with by his/her State Association.
18. Remember, whilst it is a sport to be enjoyed, you are expected to conduct yourself in a sportsman like manner at all times.
